Acts 13: 1 NIV

Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul.

Acts 13: 2 NIV

While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.

The Proconsul was the governor. This was similar to Pilate's role that he had previously held in Palestine.



But **Elymas** the sorcerer (for that is what his name means) opposed them and tried to turn the proconsul from the faith.

Acts 13: 9-10 NIV

Then Saul, who was also called *Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked straight at Elymas and said,

*(Note: from here on Saul's name is changed to Paul)

Acts 13: 9-10 NIV

"You are a child of the devil and an enemy of everything that is right! You are full of all kinds of deceit and trickery. Will you never stop perverting the right ways of the Lord?

Acts 13: 11-12 NIV

Now the hand of the Lord is against you. You are going to be blind for a time, not even able to see the light of the sun."

Acts 13: 11-12 NIV

Immediately mist and darkness came over him, and he groped about, seeking someone to lead him by the hand. When the proconsul saw what had happened, he believed, for he was amazed at the teaching about the Lord.

Acts 13: 13 NIV

From Paphos, Paul and his companions sailed to Perga in Pamphylia, where John left them to return to Jerusalem.

Paul is very upset with John leaving them as we see later in the 15th chapter of Acts

Acts 15: 37 NIV

Barnabas wanted to take John, also called Mark, with them, but Paul did not think it wise to take him, because he had deserted them in Pamphylia and had not continued with them in the work.



Acts 13: 14 NIV

From Perga <u>they went on</u> to Pisidian Antioch.







Acts 13: 14 NIV

From Perga they went on to Pisidian Antioch. On the Sabbath they entered the synagogue and sat down.

Acts 13: 15 NIV

After the reading from the Law and the Prophets, the leaders of the synagogue sent word to them, saying, "Brothers, if you have a word of exhortation for the people, please speak."

It was common practice in the synagogues to invite visiting Rabbi's to speak so they could listen to different interpretations of the scripture. Therefore Paul, being a well-known Jewish Rabbi formerly in the Sanhedrin, was asked to speak.

Acts 13: 16 NIV

Standing up, Paul motioned with his hand and said: "Fellow Israelites and you Gentiles who worship God, listen to me!

We get to hear the first and longest recorded sermon by Paul!

Acts 13: 17-41 NIV

The God of the people of Israel chose our ancestors; he made the people prosper during their stay in Egypt; with mighty power he led them out of that country;

Notice how Paul begins his sermon by letting them know that he was one of them and that God was on their side!!!

They were Special to God
He Chose them Out of the World
He Exalted Them Above the Nations

 He Brought Them as a Nation to the Promised Land

Notice also that Paul is not afraid to speak the Truth!

Acts 13: 17-41 NIV

about forty years he endured their conduct in the wilderness; and he overthrew seven nations in Canaan, giving their land to his people as their inheritance.

Where is Paul finding the material for his sermon?

All this took about 450 years. "After this, God gave them judges until the time of Samuel the prophet. Then the people asked for a king, and he gave them Saul son of Kish, of the tribe of Benjamin, who ruled forty years.

After removing Saul, he made David their king. God testified concerning him: 'I have found David son of Jesse, a man after my own heart; he will do everything I want him to do.'

"From this man's descendants God has brought to Israel the Savior Jesus, as he promised. Before the coming of Jesus, John preached repentance and baptism to all the people of Israel.

As John was completing his work, he said: 'Who do you suppose I am? I am not the one you are looking for. But there is one coming after me whose sandals I am not worthy to untie.'

"Fellow children of Abraham and you God-fearing Gentiles, it is to us that this message of salvation has been sent. The people of Jerusalem and their rulers did not recognize Jesus, yet in condemning him they fulfilled the words of the prophets that are read every Sabbath. Though they found no proper ground for a death sentence, they asked Pilate to have him executed.

When they had carried out **all** that was written about him, they took him down from the cross and laid him in a tomb. But God raised him from the dead, and for many days he was seen by those who had traveled with him from Galilee to Jerusalem. They are now his witnesses to our people.

"We tell you the good news: What God promised our ancestors he has fulfilled for us, their children, by raising up Jesus. As it is written in the second Psalm: "You are my son today I have become your father.' God raised him from the dead so that he will never be subject to decay.

As God has said, "I will give you the holy and sure blessings promised to David. So it is also stated elsewhere: "You will not let your holy one see decay.'

"Now when David had served God's purpose in his own generation, he fell asleep; he was buried with his ancestors and his body decayed. But the one whom God raised from the dead did not see decay.

"Therefore, my friends, I want you to know that through Jesus the forgiveness of sins is proclaimed to you. Through him everyone who believes is set free from every sin, a justification you were not able to obtain under the law of Moses.

Take care that what the prophets have said does not happen to you:

"Look, you scoffers, wonder and perish, for I am going to do something in your days that you would never believe, even if someone told you."

Acts 13: 42 NIV

As Paul and Barnabas were leaving the synagogue, the people invited them to speak further about these things on the next Sabbath.

Acts 13: 43 NIV

When the congregation was dismissed, many of the Jews and devout converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who talked with them and urged them to continue in the grace of God.

Acts 13: 44 NIV

On the next Sabbath **almost the whole city** gathered to hear the word of the Lord.

Acts 13: 45 NIV

When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy. They began to contradict what Paul was saying and heaped abuse on him.

Question

What happened?

Acts 13: 46 NIV

Then Paul and Barnabas answered them boldly: "We had to speak the word of God to you first. Since you reject it and do not consider yourselves worthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles.

Acts 13: 47 NIV

For this is what the Lord has commanded us: "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth.

Acts 13: 48 NIV

When the **Gentiles** heard this, they were glad and honored the word of the Lord; and all who were appointed for eternal life believed.

Acts 13: 49 NIV

The word of the Lord spread through the whole region.

Acts 13: 50 NIV

But the Jewish leaders incited the God-fearing women of high standing and the leading men of the city. They stirred up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their region.

Acts 13: 51 NIV

So <u>they shook the dust</u> <u>off their feet</u> as a warning to them and went to Iconium.

Acts 13: 52 NIV

And the disciples were filled with **joy** and with the **Holy Spirit**.
