nor any of its ropes broken.*


Isaiah 33: 21 (NIV)

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

In my vision, the man brought me back to the entrance of the Temple.

There I saw a stream flowing east from beneath the door of the Temple and passing to the right of the altar on its south side.

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

The man brought me outside the wall through the north gateway and led me around to the eastern entrance. There I could see the water flowing out through the south side of the east gateway.

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

Measuring as he went, he took me along the stream for 1,750 feet and then led me across. The water was up to my ankles. He measured off another 1,750 feet and led me across again. This time the water was up to my knees.

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

After another 1,750 feet, it was up to my waist. 5 Then he measured another 1,750 feet, and the river was too deep to walk across. It was deep enough to swim in, but too deep to walk through.

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

He asked me, "Have you been watching, son of man?" Then he led me back along the riverbank. When I returned, I was surprised by the sight of many trees growing on both sides of the river.

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

Then he said to me, “This river flows east through the desert into the valley of the Dead Sea. The waters of this stream will make the salty waters of the Dead Sea fresh and pure.

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

There will be swarms of living things wherever the water of this river flows. Fish will abound in the Dead Sea, for its waters will become fresh. Life will flourish wherever this water flows. Fishermen will stand along the shores of the Dead Sea.

Ezekiel 47: 1-10 (NLT)

All the way from En-gedi to En-eghlaim, the shores will be covered with nets drying in the sun. Fish of every kind will fill the Dead Sea, just as they fill the Mediterranean.


“If those days had not been cut short, no one would survive, but for the sake of the elect those days will be shortened.”


Matthew 16: 1-3 (NIV)

“Be careful, or your hearts will be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness and the anxieties of life, and that day will close on you suddenly like a trap.”


Luke 21: 34-36 (NIV)

Since you have kept my command to endure patiently, I will also keep you from the hour of trial that is going to come on the whole world to test the inhabitants of the earth.



But the beast was captured, and with it the false prophet who had performed the signs on its behalf.


With these signs he had deluded those who had received the mark of the beast and worshiped its image.

Revelation 19: 11-18 (NIV)

I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a white horse, whose rider is called Faithful and True. With justice he judges and wages war. His eyes are like blazing fire, and on his head are many crowns.

Revelation 19: 11-18 (NIV)

He has a name written on him that no one knows but he himself. He is dressed in a robe dipped in blood, and his name is the Word of God.

The armies of heaven were following him, riding on white horses and dressed in fine linen, white and clean.

Revelation 19: 11-18 (NIV)

Coming out of his mouth is a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations. "He will rule them with an iron scepter." He treads the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God Almighty.

*On his robe and on his thigh he has
this name written:*

**KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF
LORDS.**

their blood.*




Isaiah 34: 5 (NIV)

pitch!*




Isaiah 34: 10 (NIV)

Isaiah 34: 17 (NIV)


*He allots their portions;


*Water will gush forth in the
