
What does Covenant mean?



- •A covenant is a solemn promise to engage in or refrain from a specified action (it establishes a relationship)
- In the Bible, God enters into covenants with people when he has a relationship with them








"The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over

Exodus 12:13




The New Covenant is the promise that God makes with humanity that He will forgive sin and restore fellowship through the Blood of Christ to those who repent and turn to Him.

Jesus Christ is the mediator of the New Covenant, and His death on the cross is the fulfillment of this Covenant.







Hebrews 10: 14-17 (NASB)

For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us;

Hebrews 10: 14-17 (NASB)

for after saying, "This is the covenant which I will make with them After those days, declares the Lord: I will put My laws upon their hearts, And write them on their mind,"

Hebrews 10: 14-17 (NASB)

He then says, "And their sins and their lawless deeds I will no longer remember."

At the beginning of the Passover Seder meal in Jewish homes the middle portion of the unleavened bread, (Matza) is broken in half then wrapped in a linen napkin.

This bit of unleavened bread is called the "afikomen" which means "that which is to come".

The Afikomen is then hidden and later brought out to be served as the last morsel of food eaten at the end of the lengthy observance of this ancient Jewish feast.

1 Corinthians 11: 26 (NASB)

For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

1 Corinthians 11: 27 (NASB)

Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy way, shall be guilty of the body and the blood of the Lord.



What does unworthy manner mean?

You do not take Communion seriously!

- Signs you are not taking
- Communion Seriously

- You are not a Christian
- Your life does not reflect Jesus
- You are distracted
- It has become a ritual

1 Corinthians 11: 27 (NASB)


Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy way, shall be guilty of the body and the blood of the Lord.

Paul is saying if you do not take Communion seriously you are mocking the power and sacrifice of Jesus Christ!

1 Corinthians 11: 28 (NASB)

But a person must examine himself, and in so doing he is to eat of the bread and drink of the cup.

What does it mean to exam yourself?



2 Corinthians 13: 5 (NIV)

Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves. Do you not realize that Christ Jesus is in you—unless, of course, you fail the test?

1 Corinthians 11: 28 (NASB)

But a person must examine himself, and in so doing he is to eat of the bread and drink of the cup.

1 Corinthians 11: 29 (NASB)

For the one who eats and drinks, eats and drinks judgment to himself if he does not properly recognize the body.

1 Corinthians 11: 29 (NLT)

For if you eat the bread or drink the cup without honoring the body of Christ, you are eating and drinking God's judgment upon yourself.

1 Corinthians 11: 30 (NLT)

For this reason many among you are weak and sick, and a number are asleep.

For what reason?

1 Corinthians 11: 31-32 (NASB)

But if we judged ourselves rightly, we would not be judged. But when we are judged, we are disciplined by the Lord so that we will not be condemned along with the world.

Is there something going on in your life that you know is sinful yet you intentionally continue without repentance?

The fear of the Lord should motivate us to strive to live a Holy life!

1 Corinthians 11: 33 (NASB)

So then, my brothers and sisters, when you come together to eat, wait for one another.

If anyone is hungry, have him eat at home, so that you do not come together for judgment. As to the remaining matters, I will give instructions when I come.






1 Corinthians 12: 3 (NASB)

What does accursed mean?

God pronounced a curse upon mankind after Adam and Eve's sin in the garden.

Paul is saying anyone who says that Jesus Christ is nothing but a mere man or is only a prophet is virtually saying, "Jesus is accursed,"

But I am afraid that, as the serpent deceived Eve by his trickery, your minds will be led astray from sincere and pure devotion to Christ.

or if one comes and preaches another Jesus whom we have not preached, or you receive a different spirit which you have not received, or a different gospel which you have not accepted, this you tolerate very well!
