


# Isaiah 24: 22 (NIV)

# Revelation 20: 1-3 (NIV)





*stilled.*


# Isaiah 25: 5 (NKJV)




## 2 Thessalonians 2: 3-4 (NIV)

*Don't let anyone deceive you in any way, for that day will not come until the rebellion occurs and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the man doomed to destruction.*


## 2 Thessalonians 2: 3-4 (NIV)

*Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord.*







# Isaiah 25: 12 (NIV)


*He will bring down your high





## Luke 12: 35-40 (NIV)

*It will be good for those servants whose master finds them ready, even if he comes in the middle of the night or toward daybreak. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into.*


# Luke 12: 35-40 (NIV)



## Genesis 11: 1-8 (NIV)

*Now the whole world had one language and a common speech. As people moved eastward, they found a plain in Shinar and settled there. They said to each other, "Come, let's make bricks and bake them thoroughly." They used brick instead of stone, and tar for mortar.*

# Genesis 11: 1-8 (NIV)

*Then they said, “Come, let us build ourselves a city, with a tower that reaches to the heavens, so that we may make a name for ourselves; otherwise we will be scattered over the face of the whole earth.”*

# Genesis 11: 1-8 (NIV)

*But the Lord came down to see the city and the tower the people were building. The Lord said, "If as one people speaking the same language they have begun to do this, then nothing they plan to do will be impossible for them."*

# Genesis 11: 1-8 (NIV)

*Come, let us go down and confuse their language so they will not understand each other.”*

*So the Lord scattered them from there over all the earth, and they stopped building the city.*

- A city is where people – flee to for self-pursuits & gratification (prodigal son)
- A city is where people – become more isolated from others
- A city is where people – commit the bulk of crimes and homelessness is rampant
- A city is where people – establish a man centered leadership (god-like)
- A city is where– entertainment and amusement is of greatest value
- A city is where people – makes the laws and rules without God
