He is also reminding us that the ability to speaking foreign tongues is valuable and should not be ignored or prohibited. The ability to communicate in foreign languages and to speak to God in the Spirit in prayer is a valuable gift for the proper occasion.

So far in this letter Paul first dealt with the carnality and sin that existed in the Church in Corinth.




Then he addressed spirituality, love and the use of the gifts as well as the structure of the Church service.

A group of Epicurean and Stoic philosophers began to debate with him. Some of them asked, "What is this babbler trying to say?" Others remarked, "He seems to be advocating foreign gods."

They said this because Paul was preaching the good news about **Jesus and the resurrection**.

Then they took him and brought him to a meeting of the Areopagus, where they said to him, "May we know what this new teaching is that you are presenting?



## How do you hold firmly to the Word?



Grace and peace be yours in abundance through the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.

Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world caused by evil desires.

For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control;

and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love.

For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ...

But whoever does not have them is nearsighted and blind, forgetting that they have been cleansed from their past sins.

Therefore, my brothers and sisters, make every effort to confirm your calling and election.

For if you do these things, you will never stumble, and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

So I will always remind you of these things, even though you know them and are firmly established in the truth you now have.

I think it is right to refresh your memory as long as I live in the tent of this body, because I know that I will soon put it aside, as our Lord Jesus Christ has made clear to me.

And I will make every effort to see that after my departure you will always be able to remember these things.



and last of all, as to one untimely born, <u>He appeared to me also</u>.

Moreover, we are even found to be false witnesses of God, because we testified against God that He raised Christ, whom He did not raise, if in fact the dead are not raised.

1 Corinthians 15: 16 (NASB)

For if the dead are not raised, then not even Christ has been raised;

and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is worthless; you are still in your 1 Corinthians 15: 18 (NASB)


# Then also those who have **fallen asleep** in Christ have perished.

### 1 Corinthians 15: 19 (NASB)

If we have hoped in Christ only in this life, we are of all people most to be pitied.



What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the Word of Life-

and the life was revealed, and we have seen and testify and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was revealed to us

what we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ.

## These things we write, so that our joy may be made complete.

1 Corinthians 15: 20 (NASB)

But the fact is, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep.

### 1 Corinthians 15: 21 (NASB)

For since by a man death came, by a man also came the resurrection of the dead.



Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned Romans 5: 14-15 (NIV)

Nevertheless, death reigned from the time of Adam to the time of Moses, even over those who did not sin by breaking a command, as did Adam, who is a pattern of the one to come.

But the gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died by the trespass of the one man, how much more did God's grace and the gift that came by the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, overflow to the many!

For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so also through the obedience of the one man the many will be made righteous.

1 Corinthians 15: 22 (NASB)

### For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive.

### 1 Corinthians 15: 23 (NASB)

But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, after that those who are Christ's at His coming,

Jesus was the first to have been resurrected from the dead into the eternal. He died, He was buried and then He was raised in resurrection with a glorified, physical body. — unlike all others!

### 1 Corinthians 15: 23 (NASB)

But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, after that those who are Christ's at His coming,

then comes the end, when He hands over the kingdom to our God and Father, when He has abolished all rule and all authority and power.

1 Corinthians 15: 25-26 (NASB)

For He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. The last enemy that will be abolished is death.
