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

What is casting lots?

Casting lots was a method used by the Jews of the Old Testament and by the Christian disciples prior to Pentecost to determine the will of God. Lots could be sticks with markings, stones with symbols, etc., which were cast onto the ground and were then interpreted.



 Leviticus 16:8, "And Aaron shall cast lots for the two goats, one lot for the Lord and the other lot for the scapegoat."

• 1 Chronicles 25:8, "And they cast lots for their duties, all alike, the small as well as the great, the teacher as well as the pupil."

 Psalm 22:18, "They divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots."

 Matthew 27:35, "And when they had crucified Him, they divided up His garments among themselves by casting lots."

What two things do we have today that the disciples at that time did not have that allows us to find God's will without having to cast lots?
