Matthew 5: 1 (NASB)

When Jesus saw the crowds, He went up on the mountain; and after He sat down, His disciples came to Him.

Matthew 5: 2 (NASB)

He opened His mouth and began to teach them, saying,

Matthew 5: 3 (NASB)

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Matthew 5: 4 (NASB)

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted."

Matthew 5: 5 (NIV)

"Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth."

Matthew 5: 6 (NASB)

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied."

Matthew 5: 7 (NASB)

"Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy."

What does it mean to be merciful?

Webster's definition of Mercy

- 1.compassion or leniency shown especially to an offender or to one subject to one's power
- 2.a blessing that is an act of divine favor or compassion
- 3.compassionate treatment of those in distress

Mercy

A genuine desire to help others—not to rule and have power over others.

Seeking to help those in real need

Mercy-John MacArthur:

"Mercy is seeing a man without food and giving him food. Mercy is seeing a person begging for love and giving him love. Mercy is seeing someone lonely and giving him company. Mercy is meeting the need, not just feeling it.

Mercy-Hendrickson

Possessing a forgiving spirit toward those who sin against them -

How does this differ from the previous teachings of Jesus in this sermon on the mount?



Beatitudes Building Blocks

Those who realize their spiritual position before a Holy God, will mourn due to their sin, will develop meekness and humility, will hunger and thirst for righteousness and will recognize their need for mercy from God which creates a deep desire to demonstrate that mercy to others.

What is the difference between Mercy and Grace?

Grace and Mercy

Grace flows out of mercy which flows out of love

Grace removes the sin and mercy pardons the punishment.

Is God Merciful?

Titus 3: 5(NASB)

He saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy

Why is God merciful?

Ephesians 2: 4 (NASB)

But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us

How is mercy viewed by the world?

Is mercy common in the world today?

Romans 1: 28-31(NASB)

God gave them over to a depraved mind, to do those things which are not proper, being filled with all unrighteousness, wickedness, greed, evil; full of envy, murder,

Romans 1: 28-31(NASB)

strife, deceit, malice; they are gossips, slanderers, haters of God, insolent, arrogant, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, without understanding,

Romans 1: 28-31(NASB)

untrustworthy, unloving, unmerciful;

How to Show Mercy

1. Have compassion for the lost

Acts 7: 59-60(NASB)

They went on stoning Stephen as he called on the Lord and said, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit!" Then falling on his knees, he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them!"

Mercy

The merciful never hold a grudge, they don't retaliate or seek revenge, they are never happy because of someone's mistakes or failure, and they never gossip about another's sin or misfortune.

Mercy

Mercy is the absolute opposite of the world which gossips about others sin and finds joy in the failures of others. The world is abusive, manipulative, vengeful, and selfish.

What does mankind tend to do when they hear someone was caught in sin, is struggling with something or has suffered some type of misfortune?

Smiling with Envy: Delighting in the Downfall of Others

Jealousy drives schadenfreude.

The German word *schadenfreude* refers to delighting in the misfortunes of others, when their misfortune is of no real direct benefit to you. Although I feel uneasy even writing it, this happens quite regularly in society. We may (secretly) have a quick smile when someone who has harmed us has something bad happen to them; heck, we might even <u>laugh</u> hysterically when a friend of ours trips on the sidewalk. Of course I have never done any of those things. But from what I have heard, it happens.

Schadenfreude

The experience of pleasure, joy, or selfsatisfaction that comes from learning of or witnessing the troubles, failures, or humiliation of another.

Question

How does speaking the Truth reflect mercy?

2 Timothy 2: 24-26 (NASB)

The Lord's bond-servant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all, able to teach, patient when wronged, with gentleness correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance

2 Timothy 2: 24-26 (NASB)

leading to the knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will.

Titus 1: 10-13(NASB)

For there are many rebellious men, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision, who must be silenced because they are upsetting whole families, teaching things they should not teach for the sake of sordid gain.

Titus 1: 10-13(NASB)

One of themselves, a prophet of their own, said, "Cretans are always liars, evil beasts, lazy gluttons." This testimony is true. For this reason reprove them severely so that they may be sound in the faith

But you, beloved, ought to remember the words that were spoken beforehand by the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ, that they were saying to you, "In the last time there will be mockers, following after their own ungodly lusts."

These are the ones who cause divisions, worldlyminded, devoid of the Spirit. But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, keep yourselves in the love of God,

waiting anxiously for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to eternal life. And have mercy on some, who are doubting; save others, snatching them out of the fire; and on some have mercy with fear, hating even the garment polluted by the flesh.

Prayer

Are you praying for the lost? Are you praying for your neighbors? Are you praying for Christians who are caught up in sin? Intercessory prayer is an act of mercy, for it releases God's blessing.

Jesus replied and said, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among robbers, and they stripped him and beat him, and went away leaving him half dead. And by chance a priest was going down on that road, and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side.

Likewise a Levite also, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan, who was on a journey, came upon him; and when he saw him, he felt compassion, and came to him and bandaged up his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them;

and he put him on his own beast, and brought him to an inn and took care of him. On the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said, 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, when I return I will repay you.'

Which of these three do you think proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell into the robbers' hands?" And he said, "The one who showed mercy toward him." Then Jesus said to him, "Go and do the same."

Question

Do you think it is necessary that we show mercy?

James 2: 13(NIV)

because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

Matthew 18: 32-35 (NASB)

"Then summoning him, his lord said to him, 'You wicked slave, I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not also have had mercy on your fellow slave, in the same way that I had mercy on you?'

Matthew 18: 32-35 (NASB)

"And his lord, moved with anger, handed him over to the torturers until he should repay all that was owed him. "My heavenly Father will also do the same to you, if each of you does not forgive his brother from your heart."

Mercy is a product of our salvation but our acts of mercy are not what saves us.

Matthew 6: 2 (NASB)

"So when you give to the poor, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be honored by men.
